

Lexical Lab Summer School

Advanced Language and Culture

All our **Lexical Lab** summer courses take place at London Metropolitan University, Holloway Road campus. It's a two-minute walk from Holloway Road tube station, which is on the Piccadilly Line. From here, you can get to Holborn in central London in eight minutes. The venue is also a ten-minute walk from Highbury and Islington station, which is on the Victoria line and has a range of overground services. We suggest you check https://citymapper.com/london for journey times and routes.

The course fee include all teaching materials and afternoon / evening tours and a non-refundable £80 registration fee which covers admin costs. It does **not** include travel or applicable entrance fees.

Accommodation

We are not currently organising accommodation. Previously we have used Optivo student accommodation at Wood Green Hall. You may try them here. However, they are currently undergoing a refurbishment programme, so it is uncertain whether there will be availability. You may also try London Homestays or The Londonist, who are British Council accredited. In the past, we have found they had very limited availability for one- and two-week stays and generally offered student residences. Otherwise, you may try websites such as homestay.com, Airbnb and student.com.

Our advice would be always to book accommodation with a free cancellation policy up to a late date before the course starts or take out insurance.

Course Outline

This course is aimed at teachers and language learners with a level of English of C1 or C2. It will give you the confidence and familiarity with current issues, media representations, stereotypes, cultural and political figures and recent events in Britain – as well as a better grasp of the language often used to discuss them. The focus is largely on modern culture although there is also some historical content too. Material and tasks are more adult and appropriate for university-level students or simply for your own pleasure and language learning! The course combines discussions, lectures, different media and visits within London on the connected themes

Content

There are many different topics we could cover during the two weeks and all participants will receive a questionnaire in advance to express preferences or make requests. We will try to incorporate these into the course where there is agreement between participants. Here are some of the topics we've covered before.
